Shepherd's Center Trustee Christine Heinrich and three of her colleagues, Kara Lee, Helena Cho and Myung Nam will play traditional Korean music featuring a KAYAGUM, a Korean instrument made 2000 years ago with 12, 18 or 25 silk strings. Historically, this instrument was played only for kings.

The small class of eight was mostly white, with the exception of a few people including Zack Browning, an African American. During that last class, a suggestion was made to continue the group at someone's house. Now in his eightieth year, Zack said he had been a loner most of his life but he was ready to make some changes. He volunteered his home on Martin Luther King Jr. Drive stating that he had never had white people visit his house socially before. Sounded like an interesting idea so we agreed. He told the group that he needed about two weeks to clean up his “bachelor pad”. It was decided that the rest of the group would supply the snacks and cold drinks.

A few weeks later the group was sitting in Zack's living room bragging about family and grandchildren when the doorbell rang. It was a policeman! You never saw so many shocked faces! Concerned that the group of white seniors would be afraid to visit MLK Drive, Zack had contacted his friends at the police department to make sure an officer was visible. I think I speak for our group when I say that we did not feel any apprehension about visiting Zack's neighborhood. Officer Counts said he was happy to help Zack make his guests feel welcome. He told us that he patrols the streets and knows the residents.

We stayed for a few hours, ate, chatted and learned about each other. The meeting in Zack's home was a great “after-class” learning experience. That afternoon there was No Conflict. No Resolution. Just a group of Seniors enjoying a new experience.

ShepNet Computer Classes

The Computer classes (using Windows operating system) for persons age 50+ continue to be taught by Shepherd's Center peer volunteers. They are offered monthly in the ShepNet Computer Center for Seniors provided by Friends Homes at 925A New Garden Road. Classes meet twice weekly (Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday) in the morning (9:00 – 11:30) or afternoon (1:30 – 4:00); not on weekends or evenings.

INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTERS -- 6 sessions

Mouse and keyboard usage – required for all primary computer activities. Learn basic computer terminology and actions including those for email and internet browsing.

IMPROVING YOUR COMPUTER SKILLS – 6 sessions

Version: ___XP ___Vista

Computer applications including word processing, basic file management, discussion of spreadsheets and databases, simple internet and email usage.

INTERNET AND E-MAIL MANAGEMENT – 6 sessions

In-depth exploration of internet browsing and email options with emphasis on security. Requires skills covered in above courses. Internet access required.

MANAGING YOUR COMPUTER SYSTEM – 6 sessions

Version: ___XP ___Vista

Become more proficient in using your operating system. Manage your desktop, files and folders, menus and settings. Review security issues and maintenance.

**This course is a prerequisite for the following courses.*

WORD PROCESSING – 8 sessions

Prepare correspondence, documents, and other text materials with Word 2007. Requires mastery of above course topics and expectation to practice between class sessions.

PHOTO EDITING – 8 sessions

Using Adobe Photoshop Elements, learn to edit photos to improve, restore, enhance, and manipulate images. Camera use and downloading of pictures are not part of this course. Requires prior understanding of your computer system (see above) and experience with Picasa.
