Meeting the Challenge

Shepherd's Center of Greensboro sends its genuine and heartfelt THANK YOU to all those who contributed to the Charles and Mary Routh Endowment Fund over the past two years! More than 300 individuals made donations to this campaign which was the most ambitious fund-raising effort ever carried out by Shepherd's Center. Incredibly, during the worst economic downturn since the Great Depression, we were able to come so close to our goal of \$100,000 that the Rouths generously committed their full \$100,000 match. The Endowment now stands at \$195,000 and we are continuing to work to establish the \$200,000 principal balance.

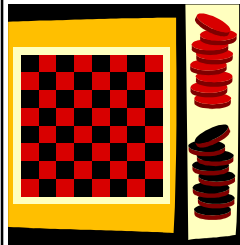

What You Should Know About the 2010 Census

In March of 2010, census forms will be delivered to every residence in the United States and Puerto Rico. When you receive yours, just answer the 10 short questions and then mail the form back in the postage-paid envelope provided. If you don't mail the form back, you may receive a visit from a census taker, who will ask you the questions from the form.

There are many reasons for you to complete your form and promptly mail it back. The data collected by the 2010 Census will be used to determine a host of issues critical to the nonprofits community. Census information affects the numbers of seats your state occupies in the U.S. House of Representatives. And people from many walks of life use census data to advocate for causes, rescue disaster victims, prevent diseases, research markets, locate pools of skilled workers and more. In fact, the information the census collects helps to determine how more than \$400 billion dollars of federal funding each year is spent on infrastructure and services like:

- Hospitals
- Senior centers
- Job training centers
- Bridges, tunnels and other-public works projects
- Schools
- Emergency services

However, you should be cautious about giving personal information to the census workers!

The Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises people to be cooperative, but cautious, so as not to become a victim of fraud or identity theft. Eventually, more than 140,000 U.S. Census workers will count every person in the United States and will gather information about every person living at each address including name, age, gender, race, and other relevant data. But the big question is: How do you tell the difference between a U.S. Census Worker and a con artist? BBB offers the following advice: If a U.S. Census worker knocks on your door, they will have a **badge**, a **handheld device**, a Census Bureau **canvas bag**, and a **confidentiality notice**.

Census workers are currently only knocking on doors to verify address information. Ask to see their identification and their badge before answering their questions and remember, you should never invite anyone you don't know into your home. **Do not give your Social Security number, credit card or banking information to anyone**, even if they claim they need it for the U.S. Census.

Census workers may contact you by telephone, mail, or in person at home. However, they will not contact you by email, so be on the lookout for email scams impersonating the Census. Never click on a link or open any attachments in an email that are supposedly from the U.S. Census Bureau.

With the vision of a botanical garden to rival the world's best, Stowe set aside nearly 400 acres of prime rolling meadows, woodland and lakefront property. Daniel Stowe Botanical Garden is one of the jewels in the Queen City's crown. Named one of the nation's 20 Great Gardens in HGTV's popular book, *Flower Gardening*, the Garden sits on 380 acres along the banks of Lake Wylie. Part nature preserve, part showcase for the best of Southern horticulture, the Garden is in the process of implementing an ambitious 50-year master plan. Currently there are over 110 acres in cultivation for guests to enjoy.

MANAGING YOUR COMPUTER SYSTEM – 6 sessions

Version: ___XP ___Vista

Become more proficient in using your operating system. Manage your desktop, files and folders, menus and settings. Review security issues and maintenance. This course is a prerequisite for the following courses.

WORD PROCESSING – 8 sessions

Prepare correspondence, documents, and other text materials with Word 2007. Requires mastery of above course topics and expectation to practice between class sessions.

PHOTO EDITING -- 8 sessions

Using Adobe Photoshop Elements, learn to edit photos to improve, restore, enhance, and manipulate images. Camera use and downloading of pictures are not part of this course. Requires prior understanding of your computer system (see above).
