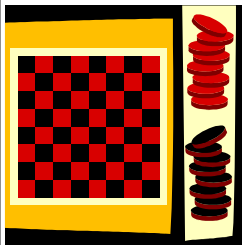

**Remembering Elbert Cole**

Dr. Elbert C. Cole, Jr., 92, of Kansas City, MO, passed away on April 28, 2010. Dr. Cole, a United Methodist minister for 49 years, served the church in military, academic, rural, urban, and industrial settings.



Dr. Cole founded the Shepherd's Centers of America in 1972, an interfaith, non-profit organization that encouraged elder involvement in the community. His leadership, with and for older adults, has resulted in a national interfaith movement encompassing over 53 individual Shepherd's Centers in 16 states, comprising a network of 15,000 older adult volunteers serving 100,000 people in 2500 community-based congregations. His memory will live on through his many Shepherd's Center friends across the country. **Shepherd's Center partners with AARP  
For Driver Safety**

The AARP Driver Safety Program for drivers age 50 and older is a 4-hour classroom course being offered to people who want to improve their driving skills.

**Participants will learn:**

- About the 3-second rule in driving;
- How to compensate for changes in vision, hearing, and reaction time;
- How medications may affect driving;
- What to do if confronted by an aggressive driver;
- Tips on driving in rain, snow, ice, fog; and
- How to tell when it is time to stop driving.

There are no tests. Upon completion of the course, participants will receive a certificate to be taken to their insurance company which may entitle them to a reduction in their premium.

## ShepNet - Formerly SeniorNet!



Due to changes at the National Office, the SeniorNet name has been changed to ShepNet but classes will continue as usual. The Computer classes (using Windows operating system) for persons age 50+ continue to be taught by Shepherd's Center peer volunteers.

They are offered monthly in the ShepNet Computer Center for Seniors provided by Friends Homes at 925A New Garden Road. Classes meet twice weekly (Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday) in the morning (9:00 – 11:30) or afternoon (1:30 – 4:00); not on weekends or evenings.

This form is to add your name to our waitlists. You will be contacted by telephone when we reach your name. Do not send any money until you are enrolled. A course fee of \$35 will be assessed at the time of your enrollment in an available class.

### PHOTO EDITING -- 8 sessions

*Using Adobe Photoshop Elements, learn to edit photos to improve, restore, enhance, and manipulate images. Camera use and downloading of pictures are not part of this course. Requires prior understanding of your computer system (see above).*
