A Letter from Jean Eason, President of the SCG Board of Trustees:

Every day we hear of a non-profit program in or beyond our community that is facing a serious resource problem in this bad economy. Shepherd's Center is not immune to this and for financial reasons our Board has decided to limit our paid staff, for the time being at least, to just two part-time employees. Lia Miller serves, since July of 2007, as half-time Executive Director with responsibility for Administration and Development. And Judy Beaver, who has been with us for 13 years, continues in a ¾-time position as Director of Programs and Services.

These two paid staff members do not conduct or even manage all Shepherd's Center activities. Their job descriptions call for them to provide support, including training and coaching, for hundreds of volunteers who are the primary reason Shepherd's Center was developed. Nationally and locally, this is an organization of older adults who volunteer to help each other.

Shepherd's Center volunteers are men and women with great wisdom, experience, skills (and talents yet to be developed) who want to continue to put these assets to good use after retirement. Although we have in the past stressed "age 60+", we also welcome and encourage retired individuals in their 50s (the "baby boomers") to bring their energy and interests to our existing or future activities.

In order to maintain our existing projects, we need a continuing supply of personnel – to use telephones, computers, printing equipment, cars, tools, creative planning and organizing skills, teaching experience; to do word processing, filing, banking, bookkeeping and accounting, organizing and registering and greeting and hosting – and dozens of other tasks.

Volunteers pick their own time frames, which may range from daily to weekly to monthly to quarterly (as for preparing newsletters for mailing). In many cases, the tasks are in the SCG office in West Market Street United Methodist Church or involve activities in other of our sponsoring churches or synagogues. In some cases, the responsibilities can be handled from home – or using your car to help non-drivers or to visit a homeowner with minor repair problems.

These gifts are as valuable as the dollars that come through our fundraising activities. It is estimated that an hour of volunteer time in North Carolina is worth over \$17. Our many hundred Shepherd's Center volunteers thus donate time with value that nearly equals our monetary budget.

If you join these efforts, you will be helping other older adults and you will discover that doing so also helps yourself in many ways. You benefit from what others do to enrich your lives and you benefit from what you do as well from the gifts of others. I'd welcome the opportunity to talk with you further about your interests -- you can call me at 299-0993. Shepherd's Wheels Southeast- announcing an extension of the Shepherd's Wheels program to the Southeast area of Guilford County! Wheels Southeast, with its own coordinator and list of drivers, is supported and funded by Guilford County Transportation and will provide one non-medical ride (of approximately 2 hours) per week for SE Guilford's older adults. Tax Counselors-free tax assistance will continue through mid-April. You must schedule an appointment by calling the Shepherd's Center office at (336) 378-0766.

Greensboro SeniorNet computer classes for persons age 50+ are taught by Shepherd's Center volunteers. They are offered monthly in the SeniorNet Learning Center provided by Friends Homes at 925 New Garden Road. Classes meet twice weekly in the morning (9:00 – 11:30) or afternoon (1:30 – 4); no weekends or evenings. A course fee of \$35 is assessed at the time of enrollment in an available class, except that the basic beginner course (4 sessions only) is \$25 and Keyboarding Workshop is \$10.
