# Voter IDs for Seniors Project

It is important that all citizens have the ability to vote, to be heard and **involved. Therefore, the Shepherd's Center of Greensboro is spearhead**ing a program to help seniors, 60 and older, to get Photo ID cards from the Department of Motor Vehicles before the 2016 General Election.



We ask you to help us make this project a big success. The program entails getting two person volunteer teams who will drive local seniors to the DMV and help them obtain Photo IDs. If possible, ask a friend to volunteer with you. If a friend is not available, we can match you up. It should prove to be an interesting experience for you, and a real community service.

In addition to finding volunteers to drive seniors, please tell us if you or someone you know

will need assistance getting the necessary ID. We will put their name on our riders' list and contact them when we have a volunteer ready to help them.

This program has two stages. Stage 1, from Feb 1 to May 15, we will line up volunteers, vet them for safe backgrounds, then train them. Stage 2, from May 15 to Oct 1, includes a press conference, PR releases and a campaign, to find clients who need the IDs. Volunteers will assist the clients to assure they have proper documents, schedule appointments and take clients to the DMV to get Photo ID. Absentee ballots may be best in certain cases.

Everyone is welcome to help. **It's not complicated. There will be infor**mational meetings and handouts detailing the correct types of documents, etc. Further, live help will be just a phone call away.


