# Is it possible? Where has the time flown?



When we turn a calendar page each month, we are often so surprised that weeks have passed; and birthdays send many people into a state of wonder! But a small non-profit serving active older adults sees the years as a celebration, a testament to providing programs and services that support so many wonderful people while enriching our community.

We opened the first volume of our scrapbook from 1987 and decided to kick off our 30th Anniversary with a focus on our core program for lifelong learning,

## Adventures In Learning.

In 1987, the new SCG Board of fifteen, with the late, great Jim Weikel as Chair and nine founding congregations for support, helped Jean Eason (our first Executive Director) pull together a group of volunteers to focus on gathering seniors for activities, service and education.

After many months of planning, the volunteers opened classes on October 20, 1987 at First Presbyterian Church. Our first session had 7 topics: Nutrition (Wesley Long Hospital), Adult Development (Mental Health Dept.), Financial Planning (Merrill Lynch), Health Issues of Seniors (Health Dept.), Physical Fitness (UNCG), Cultural Arts, and Traveling (AAA plus local agencies). In this issue, you can see that we've grown to NINETEEN topics with a wide variety of instructors and many new topics.

Over the 29 years, there have been many new participants and we have said goodbye to many friends and instructors...but there are also people who still attend classes and celebrate the many friendships made through the years. It seems that 87 semesters have provided 2,088 hours of classes plus social time to approximately 15,000 retired learners, thanks to the thousands of hours shared by our volunteer instructors.

When you look at this semester's lineup of classes we hope you experience a WOW moment. And when you read the names of the 44 volunteers who teach and plan the courses, remember the generosity of our community and the importance they see in all of you who participate in the classes. While Adventures In Learning is based on the Shepherd's Center of America model, it remains our core, the heart of SCG, and a unique lifelong learning program for our community.

Come to Adventures In Learning this fall to help us kick-off the celebration of the year ahead. It's not an ADVENTURE without you!



When Vickie and I spoke of the scope and impact of AIL over the years, we realized that 30 years ago she had no thoughts of what Adventures In Learning was. As a young widow, her

"adventures" consisted of raising her teenage son while working as a claims representative for a major insurance company.

We are fortunate

that she now spends her days planning and managing AIL ...and we know you appreciate her skills at organizing and making sure it all flows together to be the best program. Her 7 years at SCG have been quite an adventure!





Computer classes for persons age 50+ are taught by Shepherd's Center peer volunteers. They are offered monthly at the **ShepNet Computer & Technology Center for Seniors**, located at Starmount Presbyterian Church, 3501 W. Market Street, Greensboro.

Most classes meet twice weekly (Mon/Wed or Tues/Thurs) in the morning or afternoon and the duration of the class is determined by the topic and content. Course fees range from \$40+ for longer sessions to \$10 for shorter courses. Our participants have consistently given the program top ratings, with many returning for multiple classes.
