Step 2: <u>After</u> you pay the fee, you will get a confirmation email. Then, <u>we will email you the links to do the</u> <u>full Zoom online registration</u> so you will get your individual codes for each class you choose. Decide how the dates fit your schedule, which topics or instructors you prefer, and **then you will register on Zoom for each topic** you plan to attend. (People who choose only in-person classes will not need to do step 2.)

Please *only select in-person classes if* you plan to attend at First Baptist Church. The seats are limited and your reservation is considered a promise/plan to attend.

Manteo Mystery: The Unsolved Murder of Brenda Holland Instructor: Tom Brawner

On Saturday, July 1967, Campbell University student Brenda Joyce Holland failed to show up for her backstage summer job at the Roanoke Island outdoor theater production of *The Lost Colony*. The discovery five days later of her strangled, decomposing body in the Albemarle Sound spawned an intensive investigation of Brenda's odd disappearance, the homicide, and several local suspects. This

class will explore Brenda's life and murder and will evaluate the evidence and suspects in one of North Carolina's most enduring true crime mysteries.

Tom is a retired attorney who loves researching murder mysteries and bringing them to SCG.

Over the duration of this class, we will get to know this little green gem and the contribution the Welsh people have made to the world. *Edwina was born in the UK, grew up in Ethiopia, and continued her world travels for careers in construction, telecommunications and civil nuclear businesses. She is a guest presenter from the St. Andrews Shepherd's Center in South Carolina.*

African American History from 1861 to 1931

As we continue our studies with Dr. Smallwood, this session is designed to educate participants on the history of African Americans from the Civil War though Reconstruction, the late 19th Century into the Early 20th Century. It will conclude focusing on the impact of Jim Crow, segregation, lynching and white violence against African Americans during the Red Summer 1919. (earlier classes are not a prerequisite)

Dr. Smallwood was the chair of the History & Political Science Dept. and is now Interim Provost for Undergraduate Education at NC A&T State University. He is also recipient of the Holshouser Award for Excellence in Public Service 2022.

Strange Bedfellows: Three English Royal Marriages

Instructor: Carol Kay, Ph.D.

Dr. Carol McGinnis Kay, Professor of English Emerita, USC, uses a close-up look at three royal marriages to give a broader picture of England as a nation. We start in the 12th century with Henry II and Elanor of Aquitaine, a brilliant and volatile duo involved with crusades, civil wars, and the murder of an archbishop---all while laying the foundations of English government and law. Then we move to the 15th century with Henry VII and Elizabeth of York, a loving couple who founded the Tudor dynasty and ushered in the Renaissance. Our final couple will be George IV and Carolina of Brunswick, whose gross mismatch nearly toppled the government in the 19th century.

Dr. Kay is a retired Distinguished professor of English emerita at USC, guest speaker from SC St. Andrews, and the 2021 recipient of the national volunteer leadership award from Shepherd's Center of America.
