Mary Pinchot Meyer, an artist and well-connected DC socialite, was shot and killed on Monday, October 12, 1964, during her daily walk along the C&O Canal in Georgetown, Washington, DC. Was her murder the tragic result of an attempted sexual assault? Or was it more complicated, perhaps linked to her ex-husband, a high-ranking CIA official, or her two-year affair with President John F. Kennedy? We will address the people, places, and intrigue associated with this unsolved murder *Tom is a retired attorney who loves researching murder mysteries and bringing them to SCG.*

# America's 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary: "Start-Up" in Time vs. "Design-Build" in Framing Colors

Instructor: **Dr. Will Harris** 

When we think about the 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Founding of the United States in 2026, we should focus not on pinpointing a single momentous beginning but on a drawn-out sequence of an urgent,

creative making that culminates after the Civil War. This course is about ideas, not history. To avoid major distortion of the account, we must recognize that there is not one but, separately, **Three Stages of American Founding: Three distinct "paradigm shifts." Three coexisting models of the well-ordered human community. Three operating systems,** which are set out to displace O/S 0.0 (randomness; arbitrariness; chaos). Like the Bible, they are layered and interwoven in a complex fabric as a palimpsest in Framing Colors. We draw essential aspects of a Civil Rights Nation variously from each of them. They supply our authentic sources of innovative thinking, worthy argument, and meaningful difference, beyond discordant blather.

Dr. Will Harris (political and constitutional theory, University of Pennsylvania), principal scholar and head of the Initiative for the New Constitution, (International Civil Rights Center & Museum).

#### **The Piano Music of George Gershwin**

The class will explore the creative synthesis of Ragtime, Blues, Jazz, and Broadway Show Tunes in Gershwin's solo piano music. Eleven musical examples will be performed with contextual commentary and PowerPoint illustrations.

Dr. Paul Stewart retired from the UNC-G School of Music in 2016 after 46 years of service. He holds music degrees from Indiana University, the University of Illinois, and Florida State University.

He participated as a performer, clinician, and adjudicator in festivals at Interlochen, Michigan and Eastern Music Festival, Greensboro. His focus is the Piano Literature Series at UNC-G School of Music where he was a member of the piano faculty for 43 years.

In this class, a condensed history of the piano will be discussed accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation and/or video recordings.

Dr. Andrew Willis Professor Emeritus of Music at the UNC-G School of Music, where he taught instruments ranging from harpsichord to modern piano and founded the school's historical performance ensemble. Dr. Willis holds degrees from The Curtis Institute of Music, Temple University, and Cornell University
